Saint Patrick's Day is observed on March 17, the date of Patrick's death. Saint Patrick was a Christian missionary in Ireland. When he was 16, he was captured in Britain by Irish raiders and taken as a slave to Ireland, where he lived for six years before escaping and returning to his family. He worked as a herdsman of sheep. He was converted to

Jesus Christ. His faith grew in captivity and he prayed daily.

Patrick had a vision: "I saw a man coming, as it were from Ireland. His name was Victoricus and he carried many letters and gave me one of them. I read the heading: "The Voice of the Irish". As I began the letter, I imagined at that moment that I heard the voice of those very people who were near the wood of Foclut, which is beside the western sea and they cried out, as with one voice: "We appeal to you, holy servant boy, to come and walk among us."
